

## Choose your mission

Check-in Architecture is a participatory research project dedicated to architecture, design and creativity students from some of the main universities in Europe.

If you want to participate in Check-in Architecture go to [checkinarchitecture.com](http://checkinarchitecture.com), and under the headline universities you will find the list of all the universities involved in the project.

If you are a student from one of the universities that participates in Check-in Architecture, and you want to apply for a mission, here is what you have to do...

First of all, find a classmate that wants to travel with you, because to participate to Check-in Architecture's mission (shooting with a camera, interview people...) it is necessary to work in teams.

In the departures timetable on the home page you will find a list of the missions that are available at the moment.

A complete list of all the missions is also available under the new departures headline, right under the timetable. If a mission is marked red, it means that it has already been assigned. If the color is green, you can apply to do it. When you find a mission that you're interested in, and that is departing from your city, register to apply. If you are chosen for the mission, someone from the staff of Check-in Architecture will contact you to assign the mission, or, if the mission has already been taken, we can assign you another one in the future.

Once you have been assigned a mission, the Check-in Architecture staff will provide you with flight tickets, or, if you are traveling by car, the address where you will find your MINIClubman, and the voucher for the hotel.

If you're not a university student or if your university is not part of the project, go to the website [www.minispace.it](http://www.minispace.it) and register to one of the 20 fantastic Supermissions. They are open to everyone, so hurry up! Remember, to take part to the Supermissions, you must work with a partner!
